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Annual Update

Board of Education (Board) Policy JHC, *Child Abuse and Neglect*, establishes the Board's expectations of, approach to, and desired outcomes for child abuse and neglect prevention efforts in Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS)

- Be consistent with federal, state, and local law.
- Provide a safe, engaging, and supportive environment for all students.
- Utilize vigilant efforts to recognize, report, and prevent abuse and neglect of children and vulnerable adults.
- Collaborate efficiently and effectively with county partner agencies to investigate reports of suspected abuse and neglect.
- Support children who are the subject of reports of suspected abuse and/or neglect.

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Staff Training

- Districtwide Mandatory Compliance Training including *Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect*
- Continuous improvement of modules based on multi-stakeholder feedback
- Mandated reporter expectations for recognizing and reporting child abuse and neglect
- Updated information on reporting gang behavior, human trafficking, and the exploitation of children and youth
- Additional training for school administration, school counselors, and designated student welfare Liaisons

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Screening of Employees

- Conduct multipoint background checks, including fingerprinting for prospective employees
- Ensure qualified, ethical, responsible individuals who meet high expectations for professionalism
- Align to National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification Clearinghouse and House Bill 486, Child Sexual Abuse and Sexual Misconduct Prevention
- Utilize Rap Back Service (FBI) for ongoing status notifications of criminal history record information

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Screening of Volunteers/Contractors

- Required Online Volunteer/Contractor Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect Training Module
- COVID-19 Vaccination Attestation Module*
 - Fully vaccinated
 - Verified Certificate of COVID-19 Vaccination from the State of Maryland Department of Health
 - Clear expectations of masking and social distancing while in MCPS facilities

*Attestation to COVID-19 was removed on May 1, 2023

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Total Number of Suspected Cases

 During FY 2023, 3,972 suspected incidents of child abuse or neglect were reported by MCPS staff, volunteers, or contractors to CPS or Adult Protective Services. This was 20–25 percent of the total number of reports filed countywide with CPS.

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Collaboration

County Partner Agencies and the Greater Community

- Regular collaboration continued with the Montgomery County Police Department's (MCPD) Special Victims Investigation Division, the State's Attorney's Office, CPS, and Adult Protective Services, through monthly Multi-Disciplinary Team meetings, including unscheduled updates and consults.
- The Emergency Communications Center, direct line, was established between MCPS and MCPD to provide more efficient and effective communication to best support our schools, students, and communities.

² The possible outcomes of a CPS report are defined as follows:

Screened out: There was insufficient evidence that abuse or neglect occurred.

Ruled out: A finding that abuse or neglect did not occur.

Unsubstantiated: A finding that there is insufficient evidence to support a finding of indicated or ruled out.

Indicated: A finding that there is credible evidence that has not been satisfactorily refuted that abuse or neglect occurred.

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FY 2024 Considerations

- Continue collaborative improvement efforts through monthly Multidisciplinary Team meetings.
- Revise the *Culture of Respect 2.0* student training module to elevate student awareness regarding signs of neglect, abuse, and harassment. (Antiracist System Audit; Observation 3.3)
- Continue to monitor online reporting process.
- Enhance the training plan for our student welfare liaisons and school-based critical staff.
- Monitor the implementation of revised personal body safety lessons at all levels, based on student feedback and input.
